Text Neck

Back in September I was interviewed by Jacksonville Magazine about workplace postures and common practices and challenges that face people tethered to desks. My conversation with the journalist got me thinking about lifestyle problems that plague the population today.

We have known for years, about the dangers and detriments of a sedentary lifestyle and work environment. The postural problems of today have morphed slightly, as technology advances exponentially and the average person spends increasingly more time on handheld devices. According to research published by Kenneth Hansraj in the National Library of Medicine, (1) Smartphone users spend an average of two to four hours per day hunched over, reading e-mails, sending texts or checking social media sites. That's 700 to 1,400 hours per year people are putting stress on their spines, according to the research. And high-schoolers might be the worst. They could conceivably spend an additional 5,000 hours in this position, Hansraj said. (2)

Over time, researchers say, this poor posture, sometimes called "text neck,"(3) can lead to chronic headaches and muscle strain, early wear and tear on the spine, spinal degeneration and even a reversal of the neck's natural curve. While "Text Neck" is certainly a new medical term, the condition is impacting millions and is a growing critical global concern.

The human head weighs about a dozen pounds. (4) But as the neck bends forward and down, the weight on the cervical spine begins to increase. At a 15-degree angle, this weight is about 27 pounds, at 30 degrees it's 40 pounds, at 45 degrees it's 49 pounds, and at 60 degrees it's 60 pounds. This excess weight on the spine has a disastrous effect on overall health as posture begins to suffer. Experts estimate poor posture can reduce lung capacity by as much as 30 percent. It has also been linked to headaches and neurological issues, depression and heart disease. (5)

While it's practically impossible to avoid the technologies that cause these issues, individuals should make an effort to look at their phones with a neutral spine and be conscious of "hunching over" laptops tablets and other devices. I advise my patients to look down at their devices with their eyes, not bending their neck. Additionally, holding the device at eye-level can help protect the neck.
